Dear Friends,

In the midst of a veritable heat wave, Grace House was bombarded with phone calls and impromptu visits from concerned citizens who recently seen a family with several young children who were obviously stranded in Grand Rapids. Camped out near Wal-Mart in 90+ degree temperatures, the family's vehicle had apparently broken down, derailing their efforts to make it back to California.

A barrage of strangers called and dropped in at the shelter hoping we had room for the family or wondering how they could help. As has been the case for many months, Grace House was full and we were unable to accommodate them. But, because of the compassion and generosity of our community, the family was showered with food, offers of assistance and donations that enabled them to get back home.

The outpouring of concern and support for this family told me two things:

1. The spirit of "Minnesota Nice" is alive and well in our community; and
2. Outside of Grace House's volunteers, supporters and agency partners, the enormity of homelessness in Itasca County is grossly underestimated and misunderstood.

The number one reason for homelessness in our region continues to be a lack of available and affordable housing. According to an August 2013 report produced by the Minnesota Housing Partnership, **for every 100 extremely low-income renters in Itasca County, there are only 48 units available to rent.**

I have begun meeting with leaders from our local faith community to examine the need for additional overnight shelter when Grace House is full. Initial discussions with faith leaders indicate a high interest in having churches serve as overflow shelters during our bitterly cold months. I hope to convene a meeting in October where all Itasca County churches will be invited to discuss how we can work together to ensure that families, such as this one, have safe, temporary shelter.

Grace House is also part of a team of local agencies that is partnering with the Housing Institute for Greater Minnesota to create long-term solutions to the ongoing housing shortage in Itasca County. I will keep you posted on our efforts to secure funding for a future housing development project that will help prevent and reduce homelessness in our community.
