Dear Friends,

Springtime is a time of growth and change. As the snow melts and flowers begin to bloom, we're looking forward to a couple of major changes at GRACE House. Through the creative design of Itasca Community College (ICC) engineering students, a children's playground will be installed on the grounds of GRACE House this summer.

In December 2012, ICC Engineering Program Department (EPD) students elected to research and design a playground that will benefit children during their stay at GRACE House. The students spent countless hours researching the type and cost of materials needed to design a safe, yet interactive playground.

Their final design concept includes:

- ❖ A jungle-gym platform featuring monkey bars, small rock climbing wall, and spiral slide
- ❖ A teeter-totter
- ❖ Sandbox
- ❖ Swings
- ❖ Playground accessories including a canopy, telescope, and steering wheel

Playground construction costs are estimated at \$2,400, not including excavation and fencing. Some of the money in GRACE House's newly-created Children's Fund will be applied to the playground project. We need your help to bring the EPD students' design to fruition. GRACE House is 1 of 16 nonprofits in Northeastern Minnesota to receive free paint from the Valspar Foundation. This in-kind grant will enable us to paint the shelter's exterior, and give the facility a much needed facelift. We'll need 20-25 volunteers to get the building painted in one day. A volunteer painting party will be scheduled sometime this June.

I really hope you plan to join us from Noon until 2:00 p.m. this Saturday, April 13, for GRACE House's Volunteer Appreciation Luncheon. In addition to mouthwatering lasagna and homemade pies, our board will distribute door prizes and volunteer appreciation gifts. Come for the food—stay for the fun.
