Dear Friends,

June is already proving to be a busy and exciting month at GRACE House— one that is filled with plenty of collaborative projects and events. **Thursday, June 13**, marks the inauguration of “**There’s No Place Like Home**”, a collaboration between GRACE House and Judy Garland Museum designed to raise public awareness about homelessness in our community.

“There’s No Place Like Home” kicks off at the museum at 5:00 p.m. on the eve of the Judy Garland Festival weekend, with a free reception featuring wine and appetizers. With transportation provided by Arrowhead Transit, “There’s No Place Like Home” participants will be shuttled to GRACE House at 6:00 p.m. for a soup line fundraiser. For a free-will offering, event participants will be treated to homemade soups, breads and pies as well as tours of our homey shelter. This event is an important reminder that everyone deserves a home!

We’re teaming up with United Way of 1,000 Lakes on the **June 21 international “Day of Action”** to give GRACE House’s exterior a much needed facelift. Our mutual goal is to recruit and mobilize 100 “Day of Action” community volunteers who will engage in activities such as: painting the shelter and fencing, gardening and landscaping projects, and assembling personal care packages for local agencies serving people who are homeless.

Additional volunteers are still needed to ensure completion of all these projects. Individuals, families, youth groups (ages 6-18), and teams of employees are encouraged to pre-register for the June 21 “Day of Action.” Call GRACE House at 326-2790 to sign up for the 8:30 to 11:30 a.m. morning shift, the 12:30 to 3:30 p.m. afternoon shift, or both. Volunteers will receive a “Live United” T-shirt and a free lunch sponsored by Subway.

From mid June to the beginning of August, we’ll collaborate with a team of talented students from the Minneapolis College of Art Design (MCAD) who are pursuing Master’s of Fine Arts degrees. The students will create a new logo and other marketing tools to more effectively represent the mission of GRACE House and our vision for the future. MCAD students will also work with E3 Consulting Services to contribute photos and design ideas to enhance GRACE House’s new website, which we hope will be launched at the end of this month. We are so pleased to be working with these students and we welcome their creativity and artistry.

Top Five Critical Needs List

4. Women's socks
5. Children's fleece tie blankets
